The regular meeting of Crook County Fire & Rescue was called to order by President Jim Dean at 9:01 am on February 21, 2019.

Board members present were Jerry Brummer, Dennis Merrill, Dennis Bauldree, Jim Dean and Steve Lent.

Staff present was Chief Matt Smith, Russ Deboodt, Chief Dave Pickhardt, Russ Deboodt, Dan Freauff and Paula Landrus.

Guest present were George Ponte and Matt Hummel.

MINUTES

Dennis Merrill made a motion to approve the minutes from January 19, 2019. Dennis Bauldree seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

Standard of Cover- Chief Matt Smith stated a draft was included in the packet. This document is for the public to show what we offer. It also is a safety statement for the crews. Matt stated we review the document each year and update it. The grey highlighted area is changes from the prior year. The florescent yellow is changes, but has not been updated yet. Some highlights from the document are as follows:

Page 4, Responses: In 2018 the station 1201 response area received 2,873 calls for service (2,690 EMS and 183 Fire). This accounted for 83% of the total call volume for the department.

Page 5, Response area: The 1202 response area includes the majority of the Powell Butte Community from the western edge of the district to the intersection of Westwood Drive and Houston Lake Road, and Wiley Road and Highway 126. The ambulance at station 1202 is a 2008 F350 and has 120,917 miles on it.

Page 8 Responses: In 2018 the station 1203 response area received 310 calls for service (245 EMS and 65 fire). This accounted for 9% of the total call volume for the department.

Page 12 Response Times: In 2018 CCFR arrived on scene within 12 minutes of dispatch 82.3% of the time within the district boundaries.

The Board staffing at each station.

Page 13 Cardiac Arrest Data: In 2018, the national average of the out of hospital cardiac arrest survival rates were 14.9%. Due to the Districts call volume, CCFR uses 2017 and 2018 years to obtain data. CCFR attempted to resuscitate 41 cardiac arrests and had an overall survival rate of 29.2%. The study is further broken down to witnessed ventricular fibrillation arrests. The 2018 national average survival rate for this type of cardiac arrest was 52.6%. CCFR responded to 7 witnessed v-fib and surpassed the national average with a 71.4% survival rate.

Matt stated that the document will be further discussed at the March Board Meeting.

OFDDA Membership- Matt Smith stated we received an invoice from OFDDA for membership. The Board discussed the membership with OFDDA and feel that it is a lot of money for what we get.

Wildland Risk Study- Matt Smith stated a risk study was done in Oregon and Washington. Prineville made number ten in Oregon. In the study, they looked at fuel types and the regions affected by the wildland fires to do prevention.

Chief Matt Smith stated that the Elm Street Walking Bridge is going to be replaced by the City. The City is proposing a permanent walking bridge behind the fire station over to Court Street. Matt will have the proposal next month.

Dennis Bauldree made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Jerry Brummer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.
